Kitchen Items: Fragile and Essential

Objects	How to pack
Dishes and Glassware	Wrap each piece individually in packing paper or bubble wrap. Stack plates vertically like records in sturdy boxes, cushioning with crumpled paper between layers. Use dish dividers for glasses and mugs. Label boxes as "Fragile – Kitchen – Top Load Only."
Cutlery and Utensils	Bundle silverware in groups with rubber bands and wrap in paper. Place in small boxes or organizers to prevent shifting. For sharp knives, sheath blades in cardboard or use blade guards.
Appliances and Pots/Pans	Clean and dry everything first. Wrap small appliances in bubble wrap and box them with their cords taped to the side. Stack pots and pans with paper between to avoid scratches; use medium boxes.
Perishables	Donate or consume food items. Pack non-perishables like spices in small boxes with padding to prevent spills.

Clothing and Linens: Space-Saving and Protective

Objects	How to pack
Wardrobe Items	Use wardrobe boxes for hanging clothes to keep them on hangers. For folded clothes, roll them to save space and reduce creases; pack in suitcases or medium boxes by season or type.
Shoes	Stuff with socks or paper to maintain shape. Pair them and wrap in paper or place in original boxes, then into larger ones. Use shoe bags for delicate pairs.
Bedding and Towels	Fold linens neatly and pack in large boxes or vacuum-seal bags to compress. Use them as padding for fragile items in other boxes.
Accessories	Place jewelry in small organizers or egg cartons for separation. Belts and scarves can be rolled and tucked into shoes or small boxes.

Electronics and Media: Handle with Care

Objects	How to pack
TVs and Monitors	Use original boxes if available, or wrap in bubble wrap and blanket padding. Secure in telescoping boxes; label "Fragile – Electronics."
Computers and Laptops	Back up data first. Wrap in anti-static bubble wrap, place in padded boxes with foam inserts. Coil and tape cords separately.
Cables and Accessories	Sort and label cables (e.g., "HDMI – Living Room TV") in zip-lock bags. Pack remotes and chargers together in a dedicated "Essentials" box.
Books and Media	Pack books flat or spine-down in small boxes to avoid spine damage. Use paper between DVDs/CDs to prevent scratches; box them upright.

Furniture and Large Items: Disassemble and Protect

Objects	How to pack
Disassembly	Take apart beds, tables, and shelves; keep screws and hardware in labeled bags taped to the item. Photograph assemblies for reassembly.
Protection	Wrap furniture in moving blankets or shrink wrap to guard against scratches. Use corner protectors for edges.
Mirrors and Artwork	Box in mirror cartons with bubble wrap and cardboard corners. For frames, use picture boxes; label "Fragile – Do Not Stack."
Lamps and Decor	Remove bulbs and shades; wrap bases in bubble wrap and box separately. Pack shades in tissue paper-filled boxes.

Miscellaneous and Specialty Items: Customized Approaches

Objects	How to pack
Toys and Kids' Items	Sort by category in clear bins for easy unpacking. Wrap fragile toys in paper.
Cleaning Supplies	Seal liquids in plastic bags; pack upright in small boxes. Dispose of flammables per local rules.
Plants	(If applicable) Water lightly, wrap pots in plastic, and box upright with support. For long moves, consider self-transport.
Valuables	Carry personally—documents, jewelry, and cash in a secure bag.
